

## Looking for the ideal gift for Mother's Day in Toronto

Mother's Day is just around the corner – May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2018 - and it is a super celebration here in Canada, just as much as we celebrate in Brazil. If you had the chance to go to the malls and shops this week you probably noticed that the main theme of promotions and shop windows is Mother's Day – of course! When I first arrived in Toronto I was always curious to know how this date was celebrated here and if there was much difference compared to Brazil, in regard to what and how gifts were bought or delivered. I confess that by reading several Canadian blogs I found this practice very different here in Canada.

A recent survey - conducted between April 27<sup>th</sup> and May 1<sup>st</sup> of residents of the Toronto metropolitan area (GTA) - pointed out that 54% of respondents (3 out of 5 people) will wait until the weekend to buy something for their mothers. That's right, the Torontonians are not as wary as I imagined and will find a gift for moms the day before or even on Mother's Day. I already imagined that, because Canadians are much simpler and the gifts here are not so expensive - here the celebration involves "being together" and "somehow remembering moms." And there are lots of internet texts on ideas for Last-Minute Mother's Day Gifts, which involve simple souvenirs and ways to say "I love you" and "thank you" without spending much and without the stress of spending hours and hours looking for the ideal gift in the malls.

Other findings from the study that I found interesting include the following:

- 58 per cent of GTA residents, three in five, plan to purchase a gift for someone
- 67 per cent, seven in ten, of those planning to buy a gift will feel obligated to buy a gift
- 59 per cent, three in five, of those planning to buy a gift, have difficulty picking out a gift
- 43 per cent, two in five, of those planning to buy a gift, say buying a gift is a bit of a hassle
- Exactly half of GTA residents who are planning to buy a gift are likely to purchase a rose

These results say a lot about how Mother's Day is celebrated here: it involves being close to your mother, buying something simple and meaningful (not expensive gifts or spend hours and hours looking for something). And yes, mothers love to be reminded and love to be with their children on these dates, and a flower or any gesture of affection is more than enough. I speak from my own experience: here at my home we never buy expensive gifts (and rather we spend money on trips and trips), but I feel very happy when my husband remembers these special occasions and comes home with a flower, a chocolate or a card. So, the tip here is that you remember that moms love to be with their kids and love being pampered and even if you're in the rush there's always a place where you can buy some last-minute souvenir and celebrate this occasion with her.
